SACRAMENT INFORMATION

ANOINTING OF THE SICK is a healing sacrament for young and old, the chronically or terminally ill, also provided prior to surgery and is always available. To request this sacrament, please call the Parish Office.

BAPTISMS Call the parish office two weeks in advance to schedule, 402-289-4289. *First time parents are required to attend a baptismal preparation session.

CONFIRMATION is bestowed on youths in the spring of 8th grade after instruction in 7th and 8th grades. High school students in need of Confirmation go through similar preparation and also receive the sacrament in the spring. Adults receive the sacrament at the Easter Vigil liturgy after having gone through the RCIA process. For more information, contact the parish office.

EUCCHARIST is the center of our community life and is celebrated during our daily and weekly liturgies. Eucharist is encouraged for anyone who is sick or homebound and is provided through our parish's Ministry of Caring. If you, or someone you know, would like to receive communion, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY preparations **MUST** begin at least six(6) months prior to the proposed wedding date. Please contact the Parish Office, as early as possible, to make arrangements for lessons and to secure a date.

RECONCILIATION is held each Saturday from 3:30 to 4:30 pm, or by appointment. Call the parish office to make arrangements. Communal Reconciliation Services held during Advent and Lent.

VOCATIONS: If you, or someone you know, feels called to become a priest, sister, brother, permanent deacon, or join a secular institute, our priests would be delighted to speak with you. Please feel free to contact them directly or call the Parish Office.

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

ST. PATRICK'S FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

Families will meet on campus the first three Wednesdays of the month at 4:00 or 6:00pm (September thru May). (Students must always be accompanied by a parent or guardian while on campus.) The first two weeks of the month family groups will rotate between Family Faith In Action & Family Faith Encounter. These weeks provide a retreat-like experience for families to actively engage and participate in the faith in both large and small group environments.
